James Vernon Weigman, 73, passed away after his battle with cancer in Tallahassee on Wednesday, April 1, 2020. James was born September 6, 1946 in Baltimore, Maryland to James Vernon Weigman Jr. and Marjorie (née Childs) Weigman, but grew up mostly under the loving care of his grandmother, Helen. He spent his youth doing what he enjoyed – playing sports, working on cars, and listening to music. James began his career path at the Armco Steel plant as an operator. After finishing his associate's degree, he changed positions again and became a computer engineer. He finished his career in Maryland working for CMC Solutions. He and his wife moved to Tallahassee, Florida in 1992. He continued his computer engineering career first with the City of Tallahassee and later CMSI (later Computer Associates). James finished his career working as an independent consultant. James spent his retirement enjoying what he loved most – sports. He was an avid Florida State Seminoles and Washington Redskins fan (formerly a Baltimore Colts fan until they were stolen in the middle of the night). He collected memorabilia from all sports and teams. He enjoyed model cars, harkening back to working on cars in his youth. Above all, he was a devoted husband, dedicated father, and doting grandfather. James is preceded in death by his loving wife of 52 years, Christina Weigman, and son, David Lee Weigman. He is survived by his son Stephen Weigman, daughter-in-law Samantha Weigman, and grandson David Eoghan Weigman.
